The number of electrified households in ward 22 amounts to 268.

The Minister and the MEC for Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure Development, Jerry Ndou, visited Otsweleng, Ngwepe and Madibana families to check the progress of the houses that were being built for them after the need was identified during Communications Minister Faith Muthambi's visit in November 2015. They also had an opportunity to switch on electricity at 732 households at Ga-Seleka 4 and opened an access road.

The Independent Communications Authority of South Africa, Sentech, South African Post Office and South African Broadcasting Corporation disseminated information to community members and also registered them for set-top boxes during the event.

The Deputy Minister of Basic Education, Enver Surty, visited Sophakama Primary School in Dunoon, Cape Town on 6 April 2016 as part of National Imbizo Focus Week programme.

The new buildings of the school were handed over in June last year by Deputy Minister Surty and the Deputy Minister of Human Settlements, Zoe Kota-Fredericks.

The visit by the Deputy Minister was aimed at fostering better relations with the community of Dunoon and also to monitor progress made by Sophakama Primary School after the handover of R40 million to the school in June 2015. The Department of Basic Education is interacting with parents and school communities across the country under the theme: "Together we move South Africa forward: Grow South Africa".

Deputy Minister Surty also presented 2 000 food parcels to learners to motivate them to focus on their studies in order to help make South Africa a better country.

The school principal, Sabelo Makhubalo, took the Deputy Minister around the school, showing him the progress and how they use the resources of the school.
