On 14 November 2014 at Ilanga Estate in Bloemfontein, the Minister of Communications, Ms Faith Muthambi held an Imbizo with all government communicators and community media in the Free State Province. As explained by the Chief Director for Provincial and Local Liaison (PLL), Mr Michael Currin from the Department of Communications (DoC) the purpose of the Imbizo was to talk about the industry and synergies on the matters of communication in the province. This was said just after the Provincial Director General, Mr Ralikontsane as he reminded everybody that the meeting took place as part of implementation of National Development Plan's Chapter 13.

The programme of Imbizo was divided into two sections, one was for communicators and the other one was for community media. During the Imbizo there were many





	issues that were raised and identified as challenges to effective communication. Municipalities not prioritising communication and budgeting less or even not budgeting for communication at all came top during the Imbizo. Most municipalities operating without having the communication unit was also a disturbing issue. Communicators were urged to write opinion pieces and newspaper articles as part of communicating government massages. MEC for Finance, Ms Elzabe Rockman urged that the relationship between Department of Communications and the Free State Government be strengthened.
Burning issues in the Imbizo: "To strengthen the relationship between Department of Communications and the Free State Government" "No Stakeholder Relations between SARS and all departments." "SABC to change the approach of coverage i.e. they must not take short clippings and leave out the important issues of the discussion. It must be proactive, plan in time for government activities" "Most municipalities do not have communication units" "Partnership of Communication Nationally must be visible" "Lack of skills, equipment, funds and infrastructure at the local media" "Community Radio Station must be creative and innovative and community radios must be accessible to its listeners"	<image/> <image/>
