The activation provided youth with much-needed information on other government programs that will assist them in looking for tertiary institutions. The Central Application Clearing House (CACH) was providing matriculants with a second chance to gain entrance to post-school institutions. This invaluable service assists students whose original application may have been unsuccessful but have subsequently improved their final Grade 12 results. Some are not accepted to tertiary institutions due to a lack of sufficient entry points required.

The CACH sign-up service allows candidates to "sign up" for consideration by any institution that has indicated their intention to participate in CACH. The platform made possible by the Department of Higher Education and Training was also used to provide the youth with an opportunity to do primary health tests. One of the youths, Tebello Molete, said, would share the information with her peers.
