Information activation drive at Cape Town train station

President Cyril Ramaphosa delivered the State of the Nation Address (SoNA) on 8 February 2024 at 19:00. In the run-up to the SoNA, the Government Communication and Information System hosted a communication awareness campaign to alert and educate citizens about the importance of the speech.

Following the address, several communication platforms are activated to enable government to expand on key programmes/priorities outlined by the President such that this then becomes an opportunity to communicate the Programme of Action for government and to empower citizens with useful information that can better their lives.

Cape Town train station is the hub of the Metrorail Western Cape commuter rail network, which is operated by the Metrorail division of the Passenger Rail Agency of South Africa (PRASA). A day before SoNA, the GCIS in the Western Cape, in partnership with PRASA conducted an outreach programme aimed at highlighting new development from the organisation and providing overall feedback to communities on progress made since the last SoNA, highlighting the continuous work of government. The outreach, which encompassed elements of information distribution blitz and exhibitions served as a platform to market the SoNA and as means of unlocking service delivery.

Key departments that formed part of the outreach included Department of Justice and Constitutional Development, PRASA, Department of Correctional Services, South African Police Service and the City of Cape Town.

Pre-State of the Nation Address (SoNA) activities
