Oversight visit aids service delivery assessment

The Executive Mayor of Xhariep District, Irene Mehlomakulu, visited Oppermaansdorp, in Letsemeng Municipality on a service delivery oversight on 30 April 2024. The purpose of the visit was to give the community a platform to interact with government on service-delivery issues such as water leakages, blocked sewer lines and sewer spillages, poor access roads and the Expanded Public Works Programme job opportunities. The Mayor of Letsemeng Local Municipality, Bonolo Mocwaledi, and senior personnel at both municipalities, was part of the entourage that accompanied the Executive Mayor.

Executive Mayor Mehlomakulu tasked responsible senior managers to immediately deal with the issues the community raised. As a build-up campaign, the Executive Mayor visited the local tuckshops to monitor health compliance on goods they are selling to the people. The main programme was held at the Lutheran Church where 56 new school shoes, 22 blankets and 20 pairs of boots were donated to the needy elderly women and men. Government institutions such as the Department of Home Affairs, South African Social Security Agency and the Department of Social Development were also part of this programme and they provided services to the people.

Commitments made bears fruits

President Cyril Ramaphosa officially opened the Newlyn Park Bayhead Rail Terminal in Bayhead and the new Tetra Pak food processing manufacturing plant in New Germany in KwaZulu-Natal on 29 April 2024. Both these companies made pledges at the 2019 South African Investment Conference. President Ramaphosa applauded the Newlyn Group and its partners, C Steinweg Bridge and Access World, against the backdrop of COVID-19, July 2021 unrest and 2022 floods in eThekwini, for their perseverance.

competitiveness as part of the NATCOR trade corridor. Construction of the terminal created 4 013 direct construction jobs while the facility employs 1 000 full-time staff members. The Tetra Pak manufacturing plant is the only aseptic packaging producing plant for domestic use and export, in Africa. President Ramaphosa commended the Tetra Pak, an international company based in KwaZulu-Natal, for its support of government's goals in driving innovation, promoting South Africa as an investment destination and promoting transformation in the economy.

"This illustrates what can be achieved when government and business work together," said President Ramaphosa. The new terminal will expand the logistics capacity in the country and enhance global

Jouberton community receives government services

The community of Jouberton in the Matlosana Local Municipality was the latest to receive the North West Provincial Government accelerated service delivery programme Thuntsha Lerole. This comes after the third phase of the province-wide programme took place on 10 May 2024 at Extension 34 of Jouberton.

The provincial Thuntsha Lerole programme takes place each Friday at a selected municipality, while district and local programmes also follow suit in their identified areas. Service delivery to the people is at the core of the programme, where potholes are patched, drains unblocked, oversight on government institutions is done and other essentials are handed to the community. Led by the Acting Premier and MECs, the Thuntsha Lerole programme gives government an opportunity to engage the community through a feedback session where the progress of the day's work is presented.

Among some of the work was the oversight visit to Zamukulunga Secondary School, which recently received refurbishments after the flood damage. Road blocks on major roads and inspection of compliance status on tuckshops and taverns were also done. Various non-profit organisations also received cheques to help on their daily operations. Illegal dumping sites were also cleared on the day.

On his feedback address, the Acting Premier of North West, Nono Maloyi, said: "There are many projects within the municipality of Matlosana which are disturbed by the community members. There are various complaints mechanisms in place to raise dissatisfactions. We have engaged the police to help assist to protect all the contractors that are working in the municipality. We are aware that these disruptions might be caused by unemployment, however, work has to continue."

He further said that the community of Jourbeton should join all the work creation programmes to avoid criminality and gangsterism. He said that the state is ready to fight criminality with all it has.
