# Nyanga High School receives tablets

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The Eastern Cape Education MEC Fundile Gade encouraged Nyanga High School Grade 12 learners to strive for the better as they returned to school on Monday, 8 June 2020. MEC Gade said this during a ceremony to hand over tablets to the school as part of the e-learning programme rollout.

The tablets came with five gigabytes of data, zero-rated sites and two enabled sites. The e-learning programme will be carried out throughout the Eastern Cape schools to ensure that learners catch up with their school work, following months of lockdown. "Yes we are a nation that is on a lockdown, we are a nation that is in isolation, but our brains are not on lockdown so lets resist a temptation of a nation whose brains are on lockdown. We must be able to find practical ways to live around COVID-19," said the MEC.

The department committed to ensure that learners from special schools also receive tablets that are preloaded with assistive software. Situated in rural parts of the province, Nyanga High School is among the best performing schools in the Eastern Cape.

# New home for a poor family in Limpopo

A family from Sekhukhune has benefited from the district municipality's initiative of assisting poor families. The family, headed by a 109-year-old woman, is the beneficiary of a newly built and fully furnished house at Mooihoek Village in Fetakgomo, Tubatse Local Municipality.

Ms Maria Legadi Maroga received the house on 8 June 2020. The house was built by Mr Phadime Seroka – owner of Mothakge Phadime Construction Company. Mr Seroka indicated that he was deeply moved by the appalling conditions under which the Maroga family was living when he got a call from the Sekhukhune District Executive Mayor Stanley Ramaila to assist the family. He built a fiveroomed house – three bedrooms, a kitchen and a sitting room.

"I am very much grateful that we could restore the dignity of the the family after toiling years without shelter. God be praised," said Mayor Ramaila after officially handing over the keys to Ms Maroga. He promised to come back to celebrate Ms Maroga's birthday.

#### **Resuming of teaching in schools**

On 8 June 2020, the Northern Cape Provincial Command Council, led by the province's Premier, Dr Zamani Saul, conducted an assessment on the readiness of schools across the province. The aim of these visits was to monitor the steady return of all Grade 7 and 12 pupils to schools and to ensure that all schools adhered to and complied with the set COVID-19 health regulations.

The team visited Sol Plaatje Primary School and Green Point High School in Kimberley. The Premier urged stakeholders to practice social distancing, wear masks and regularly wash their hands using a soap or hand sanitiser. The re-opening of schools programme was coupled with the Love Your School campaign, which was launched by the Premier to raise awareness on the devastations caused by unhygienic environments.

The Premier said it was crucial for learners and educators to comply with all COVID-19 safety measures that had been put in place and take ownership of their schools. The Council of Education Ministers has announced that Grade 6, Grade 11 and Grade R learners will return to school on Monday, 6 July 2020 while other grades will be phased during the month of July in a differentiated approach within stipulated time frames.
