Exhibition exposes youth to maritime careers

The South African Maritime Safety Authority (SAMSA) in collaboration with the Limpopo Department of Transport and Community Safety and the Department of Education hosted a Career Exhibition at Matshumane Secondary School in Glen Cowie, for the learners of Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality, on 25 August 2022.

The main purpose of the event was to expose the participating learners to different careers in the maritime industry.

The exhibition catered for learners from 10 secondary schools, with six being from Lobethal Circuit, three from Ngwaritsi Circuit and one from Glen Cowie Circuit.

SAMSA is responsible for the safety of life and property at sea, preventing and combating pollution from ships in the marine environment, and promoting South Africa's maritime interests.

In her address to the learners, SAMSA Acting CEO Zamachonco Chonco indicated that their organisation is an implementing agency for the Department of Transport, therefore they take instructions from the department.

Careers in the maritime industry include marine and ship engineers, crewmember, deck officers, maritime law, tug masters, marine pilots, harbour masters, ship surveyors and maritime environmentalist.

Limpopo MEC for Transport and Community Safety Polly Boshielo, emphasised the importance of education and how learners should get focused to their studies regardless of their family backgrounds.

"Where you come from must never determine where you are going. We brought opportunities to you today so that you can be informed and educated to improve your lives and live well," said the MEC.

The schools that participated in this exhibition are Bopedi Bapedi Secondary School, Kgoshimoroangwato Secondary School, Ngwanatshwane Secondary School, Mantlatle Secondary School, Modipadi Secondary School, Molebeledi Secondary School, Nkgonyeletse Secondary School, Phuthikwena Secondary School, Rantobeng Secondary School and Matshumane Secondary School.

Crime prevention Imbizo in Barberton

In response to the concerns raised by the Barberton community during the District Development Model Presidential Imbizo in May 2022, Mpumalanga MEC for Community Safety, Security and Liaison Vusi Shongwe led an Imbizo at Barberton Sports Ground, on 10 September 2022, to address increasing crime statistics.

Stakeholders such as the Government Communication and Information System, South African Police Service (SAPS), the Hawks, Independent Police Investigative Directorate (IPID), Road Traffic Infringement Agency, Barberton Community Policing Forum, Department of Correctional Services, the City of Mbombela Municipality and Ehlanzeni District supported the event and engaged with the community.

Among the issues addressed were illegal mining, panga killings, gangsterism, gender-based violence, corruption, torching of houses and missing documents within police stations.

The community raised serious concerns regarding the high level of gangsters who have taken over the streets of Emjindini, terrorising communities. Community members indicated that they feeling scared and unsafe within their own homes. They also addressed the issue of how they were afraid of opening cases. In her response, the Head of IPID, Dikeledi Ntlatseng, urged the community to report corrupt police officers. She promised that community members would be protected.

SAPS Mpumalanga Provincial Commissioner Lieutenant-General Semakaleng Manamela said, "Issues of corruption will be dealt with without fear or favour, and government will not tolerate officers who are busy acting against the pledges they made to protect this country against criminal activities."

In his keynote address, MEC Shongwe said, "The terrorisation of communities in Barberton and Emjindini at large will soon be a thing of the past because we are here to bring back the dignity of this town. We will not allow this situation as it will kill the economy and prevent possible investors from investing in this tourist attraction area."

Stakeholders and the community pledged to work together to curb crime in communities.

Presidential investment oversight visit

President Cyril Ramaphosa undertook his KwaZulu-Natal provincial investment oversight visit at the Hesto Harnesses new manufacturing plant in KwaDukuza, iLembe District Municipality, on 13 September 2022.

The President was joined by the Minister of Trade, Industry and Competition, Ebrahim Patel, KwaZulu-Natal Premier Nomusa Dube-Ncube, MEC for Economic Development, Trade and Environmental Affairs, Siboniso Duma, the Mayor of Ilembe District Municipality, Councillor Thobani Shandu, and the Mayor of KwaDukuza Local Municipality, Councillor Lindi Nhaca.

The government leaders were warmly welcomed by the staff and management of Hesto Harnesses, Metair Investments and Yazaki Corporation as they toured the plant and engaged with employees.

President Ramaphosa said he was "blown away" by the enthusiasm and warmth of the employees on the floor.

Approximately 70% of the workforce is female and the President praised Hesto Harnesses for embracing gender transformation.

Minister Patel said the new manufacturing plant, which has employed 4 000 people, meant that there were 4 000 reasons to celebrate, 4 000 families that have food on their tables, and 4 000 consumers who will be buying clothes and using public transport, thus generating more activity in the area and contributing to economic development.

Hesto Harnesses, a subsidiary of Metair Investments, in partnership with Yazaki Corporation, manufactures wiring harnesses and instrument clusters for Toyota, Isuzu, Nissan and Ford. Metair Investments exports products to approximately 46 countries.

The Hesto Harnesses new manufacturing plant in KwaDukuza forms part of the R1.4 billion commitment by Metair Investments to support the expansion and localisation of the new Ford Ranger and marks the realisation of the pledges made at the South Africa Investment Conference.

In his State of the Nation Address in 2019, President Ramaphosa outlined a re-imagined industrial space with the following pillars: localisation of production, industry masterplans, and expansion of trade with the rest of Africa, more investment and green industrialisation.

This new plant at Hesto Harness is a step toward the realisation of this reimagined industrial space.
