Community educated about COVID-19 vaccine

The Government Communication and Information System partnered with the Matatiele Local Municipality, Alfred Nzo District Municipal Health Services and Disaster Management Services to conduct a loud hailing awareness programme on COVID-19 vaccine in KwaNkai village, Eastern Cape on 10 March 2021.

The Matatiele Local Municipality is identified statistically as the leading locality with high COVID-19 infection rate compared to other three local municipalities under Alfred Nzo District Municipality. KwaNkai is said to be one of the villages where most community members do not adhere to the non-pharmaceutical safety measures.

The loudhailing created awareness of the district roll-out plan, how and from which vaccine centres will receive the COVID-19 vaccine throughout the district.

Stakeholders also held an engagement session with Xesibe Traditional Council, to engage traditional leaders and present the COVID-19 roll-out plan of government. COVID-19 vaccine information products were distributed to community members to provide them with further information and dismiss fake news.

Deputy President David Mabuza conducted an oversight visit at Emfuleni Local Municipality on 23 March 2021, as part of the work of Inter-ministerial Committee on service delivery.

The Deputy President was accompanied by the Gauteng Premier David Makhura, the Minister of Human Settlement, Water and Sanitation, Lindiwe Sisulu, the Deputy Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs, (CoGTA) Obed Bapela, the Deputy Minister of Trade Industry and Competition, Fikile Majola, and the Gauteng MEC for Human settlement, Urban Planning and CoGTA, Lebohang Maile.

The visit started at Emfuleni Local Municipality where the Deputy President Mabuza was briefed on the progress made on the Vaal River System

rehabilitation in terms of water and to capacitate the municipality to sustainably manage water services operation. They then proceeded to Sebokeng Waste Water Works.

The Deputy President applauded the progress made towards the improvement of the water rehabilitation system.

“I am quite happy about the progress I have noticed. Remember the last time we were here, this module six was not working. It was still under construction. I am happy today to see that this module is working,” said Deputy President Mabuza.
