SYNOPSIS: GCIS supported the Deputy Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs, Ms Thembi Nkadimeng when she conducted a working visit to PJS, Site B, BT Site C and Covid Informal Settlement Areas in Cape Town. The Deputy Minister witnessed the challenging living conditions of the residents and met with the residents who were affected by the recent fires. She promised the residents that she will make a follow-up visit in November 2022, after the consultation with the Minister of Human Settlement, City of Cape Town, and Water and Sanitation on what must be done to intervene to change the poor conditions people are living under in these identified areas.

Deputy Minister also highlighted the need for residents to cooperate with the City of Cape, their own Ward Councillor and other departments that are responsible to solve the challenges of service delivery in their areas, including advice to avoid settling in areas identified as wetlands.
