The games ...


A total of 3.18 million spectators attended the 64 matches of the tournament, which is the third-highest aggregate attendance behind the United States in 1994 and Germany in 2006.

Thousands of jobs were created for the construction of the World Cup stadiums. Construction workers on these stadiums were given extensive skills training, which will enable them to meet the much needed demand for skilled workers on other construction projects post-2010.
